
Setting up Flickr


Setting up a Flickr account

Open a web browser such as Internet Explorer and type this url in the address bar.




Click on the **Create Your Account** button. You will be taken to this screen.






Sign in with your **Yahoo ID**. You will be taken to this screen.




Click on Create A New Account. You will be taken to this screen.




Click on **Upload your first photo**. You will be taken to this screen.




Once you have browsed to the photographs and selected them for upload decide whether they will be **private** or **public** and then click **Upload**. You will be taken to this screen.




When the photographs have uploaded they will appear on the following screen.




Add a title, description and tag to each photograph and then click **Save**. You will be taken to this screen.



You can now organise your photographs by creating sets for example. Click on **Sets** to organise the photographs. You will be taken to this screen.



Follow the instructions on screen. Once you have finished the sets will be listed on your Flickr page.



Click one of your photographs. Look closely at the example below. You will notice that each photograph has a range of buttons situated above.



Add Note: Great for annotating parts of a photograph.

Send To Group: Forward the photograph to a specific group of people.

Add To Set: Add the photograph to a set.

Blog This: Add the photograph to your blog.

All Sizes: View the various sizes of images.


Order Prints: Order copies of the image.

Rotate: Rotate the image.

Delete: Remove the image.

Click on the **Blog This** button. You will see the following screen.






Click on "do that know". You will see the following screen.



Click on **Next**. You will see the following screen.




Head over to Google now

Click on **Head over to Google now**. You will see the following screen.




Click on Grant access now. You will see the following screen.




Select your new blog. Click on Next. You will see the following screen.




Click on All Done after checking the details. You will see the following screen.




Click on Create a custon posting template. You will see the following screen.
