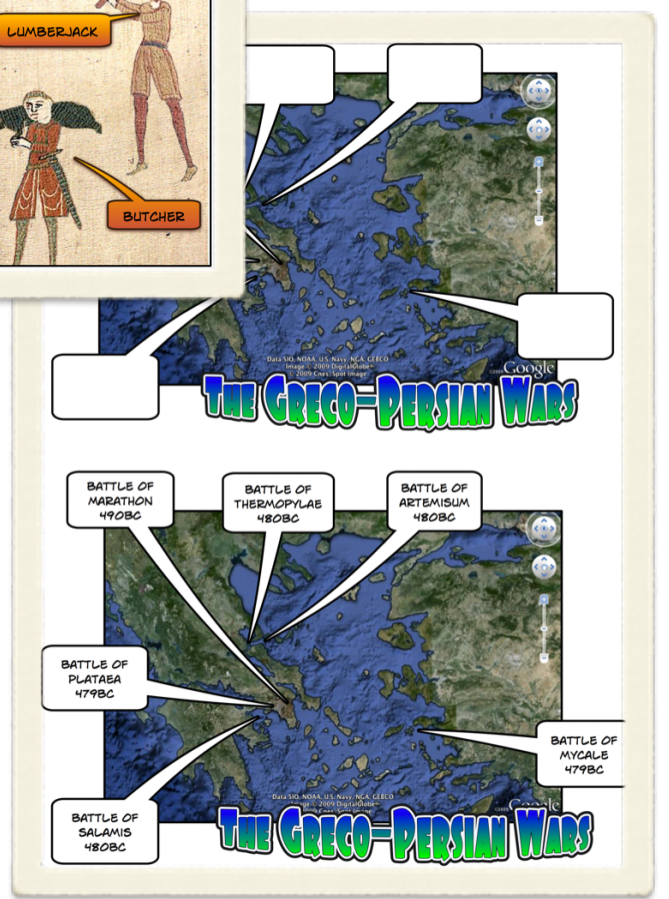
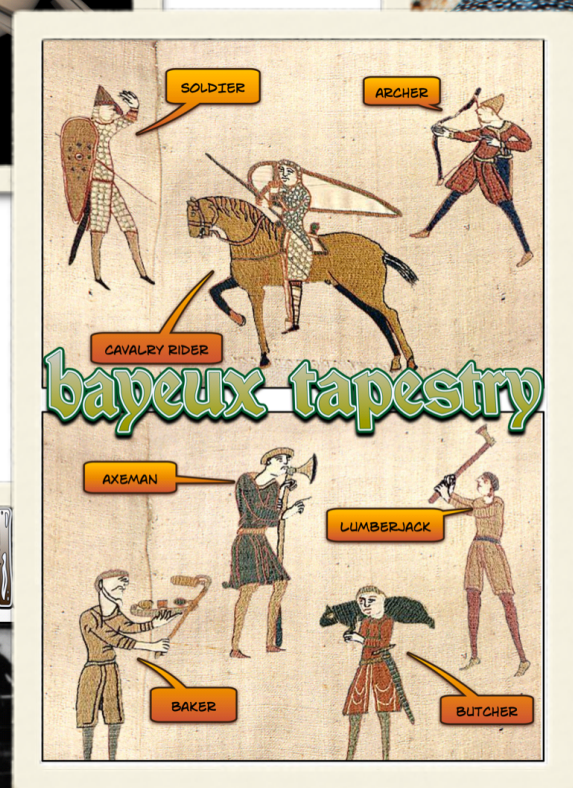
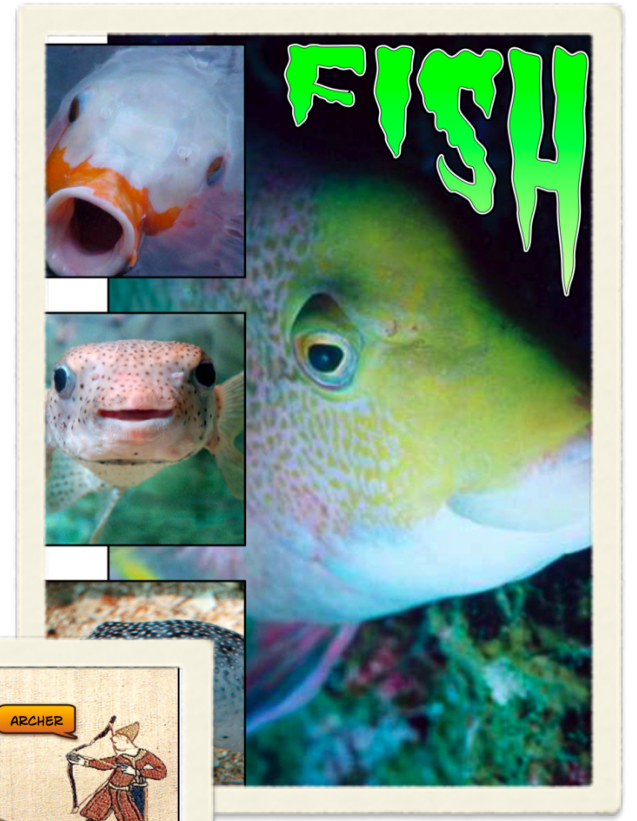
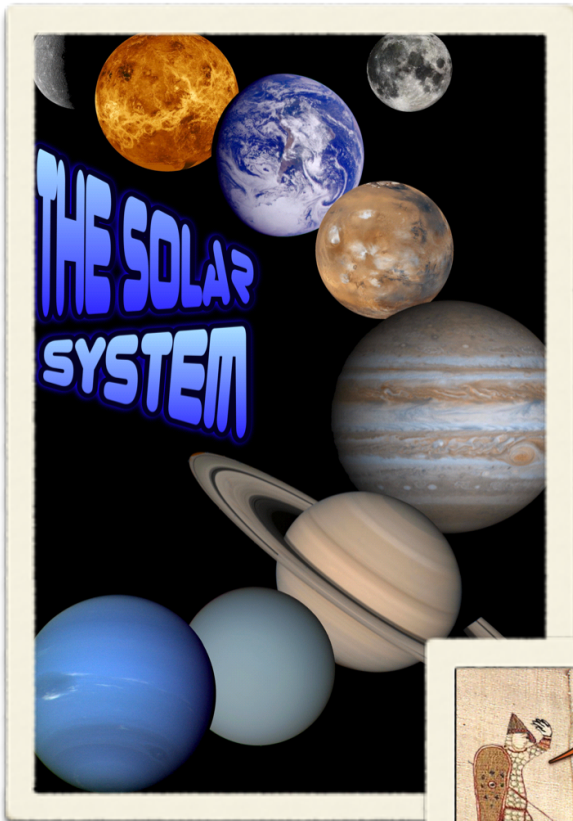
Instructions:

1. Download and install Comic Life for Windows or Mac: <http://plasq.com/downloads>
2. Set your page layout to portrait or landscape style using the Page Setup menu
3. Explore the different template styles
4. Add different images from your computer
5. Click on a panel once to adjust its position, dimensions and style
6. Double click on a panel to move, resize and mask an embedded image
7. Add speech bubbles and titles
8. Click on any element to adjust its style
9. Export your comic as a PDF, images, web site or movie

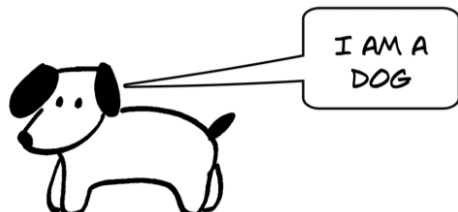
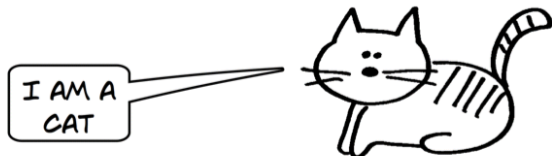
Posters and diagrams

Documents created using Comic Life need not use the supplied templates or panels. Simply add images, titles and speech bubbles to a blank page to create a poster like that illustrated below.

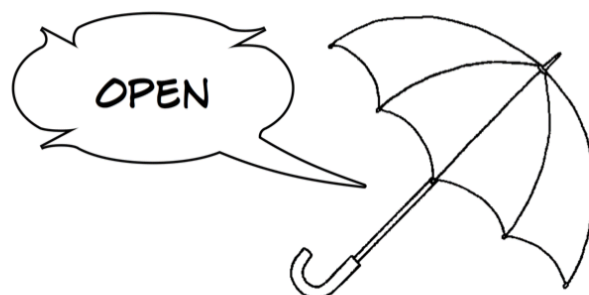
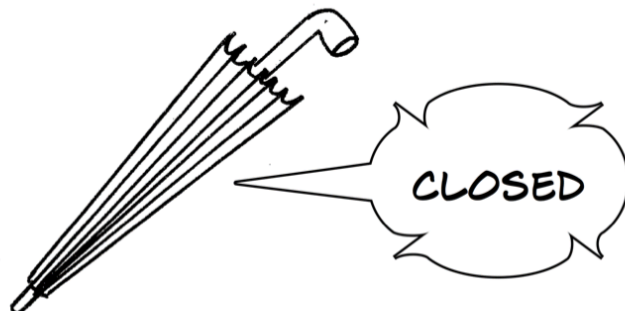

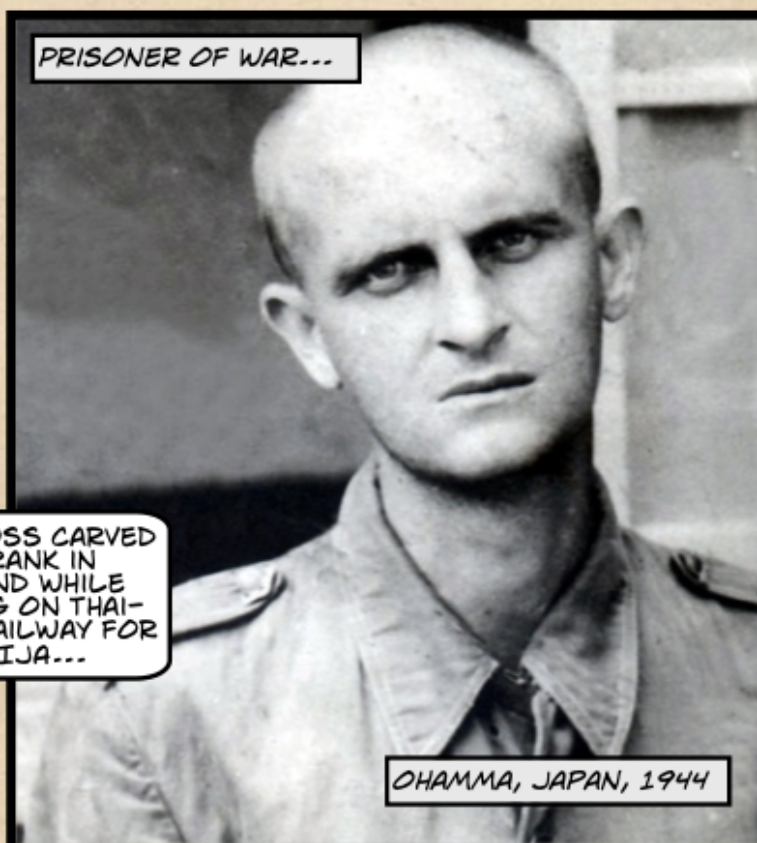

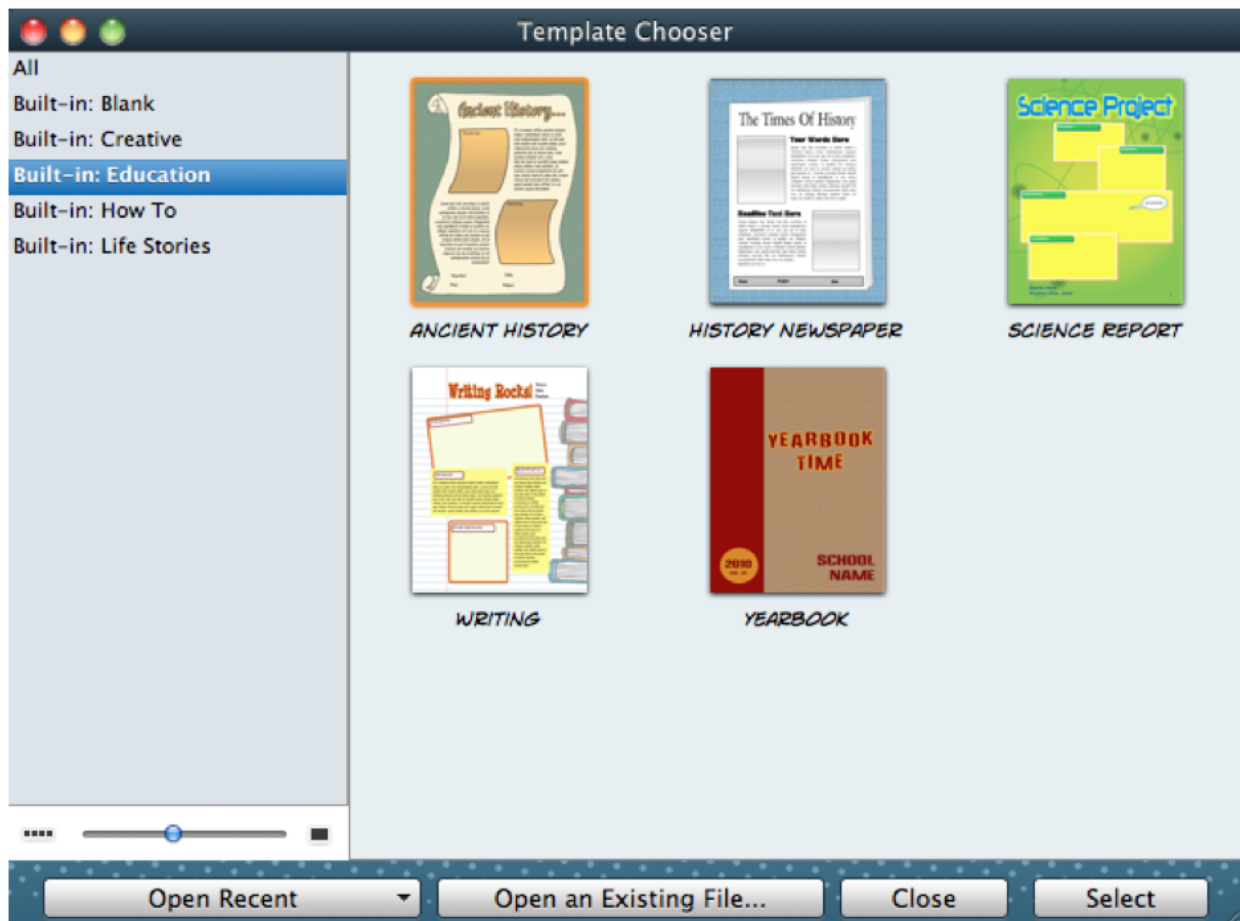


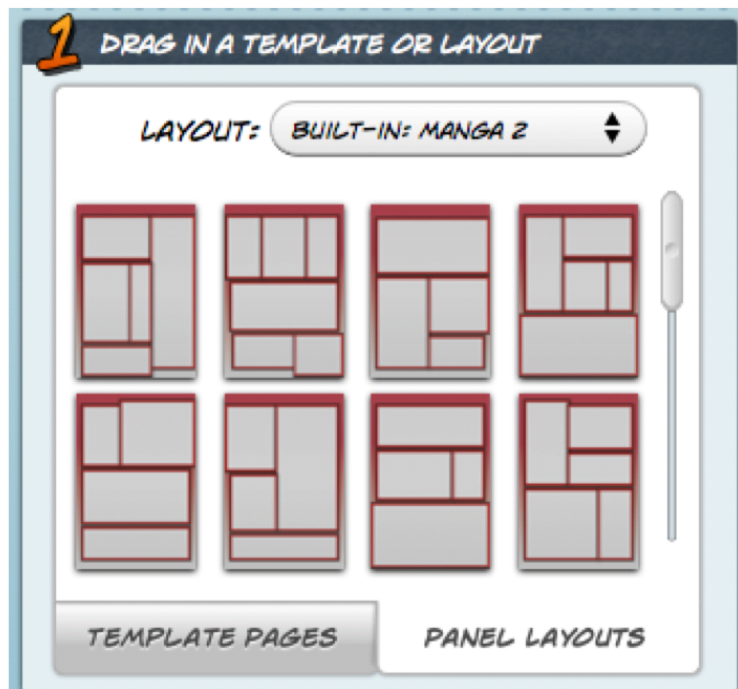

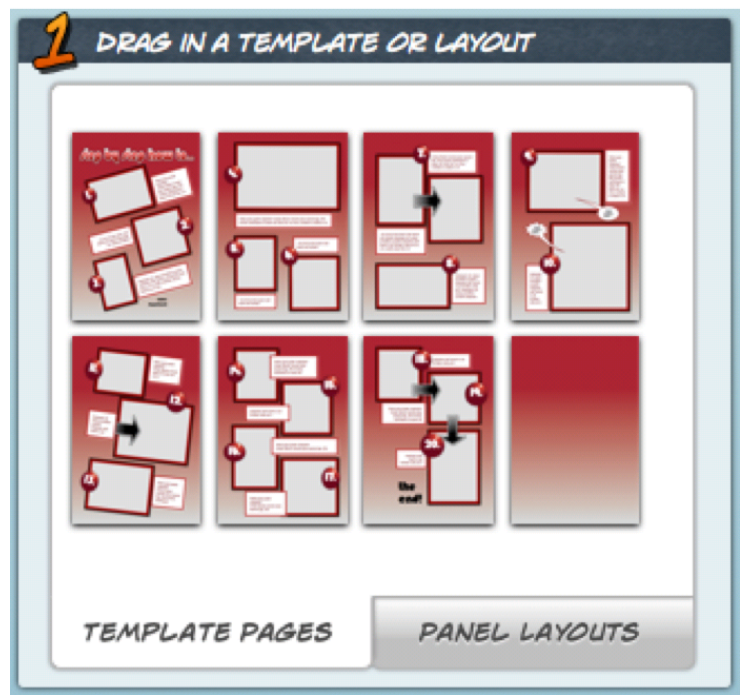
